### **Conflict of Interest Statement**

The Canadian Journal of Midwifery Research and Practice (CJMRP) requires all authors and peer reviewers to declare any conflict of interest associated with the submission or review of an article. The CJMRP has adopted the Uniform Requirements for Manuscripts Submitted to Biomedical Journals 2001, as adopted by the International Committee of Medical Journal Editors (ICMJE) (<http://www.icmje.org>).

When a participant in the peer review and publication process — author, reviewer or editor — has ties to activities that could inappropriately influence his or her judgment indicate a conflict of interest. Even when judgment is not influenced and conflict must be declared. Public trust in the peer review process and the credibility of published articles depend on how well conflict of interest is handled during writing, peer review and editorial decision-making. Bias can often be identified and eliminated by careful attention to the scientific methods and conclusions of the work. Participants in peer review and publication should disclose their conflicting interests, and the information should be made available so that others can judge their effects for themselves.

#### **Authors:**

When authors submit a manuscript, whether an article or a letter, they are responsible for recognizing and disclosing all conflicts of interest that might bias their work. They should acknowledge all financial support for the work and other financial or personal connections to the work. All listed authors should have been involved in the conception, creation and revision of the submitted manuscript. Each author should complete a conflict of interest declaration, a process that should be facilitated by the corresponding author.

#### **Reviewers:**

External peer reviewers should disclose to editors any conflicts of interest that could bias their opinions of the manuscript, and they should disqualify themselves from reviewing specific manuscripts if they believe it appropriate. The editors must be made aware of reviewers' conflicts of interest to interpret the reviews and judge for themselves whether the reviewer should be disqualified. Reviewers must not use knowledge of the work, before its publication, to further their own interests.
